Yet the message of Christmas is that God has not forgotten us.



EXTRAORDINARY FIRE AT BUNINYONG -

On Wednesday night a fire of a very extraordinary description took place at the store of Mr Adam Birrell. It appears that Mr Birrell retired to rest at his usual hour, about eleven o'clock, his bedroom being at the side of the shop, which is near the back store, where the spirit casks are kept. Shortly afterwards upon his opening his eyes, he saw a glaring light proceeding from the back store, and upon closer examination, found three of the taps on casks containing rum, brandy and whiskey, running and fact feeding the burning element. He and his storekeeper at once commenced operations to put out the fire, by throwing water on, not knowing at the time that it was spirits on fire, and afterwards put it out by throwing on blankets. The storeman in turning off one of the taps, burnt his hand severely - the tap, as also a measure placed under one of the casks which leaked, being nearly red hot. The position between the store and shop was also burnt. About ten gallons of rum was lost, besides a quantity of brandy and whiskey, one of the casks being nearly burnt through.

Fortunately the gunpowder, of which there were three kegs, was in the store beyond. The outer door was found open, with the bar, which was a loose one, behind the door in its usual place in the daytime. How the fire originated remains a mystery. Mr Birrell has offered a £100 reward. We are informed that neither the store nor stocks were insured. It would appear that the fire originated and the taps were turned on by some evil disposed person, and we only hope that the miscreant, whoever he is, will be found out and punished as he deserves. – Buninyong Telegraph. 24 November 1857

Super-cell Storm Hits Area

At 2030Hrs on 30th of November, a super-cell storm swept through the townships of Sebastopol, Mt.Clear, Mt.Helen, Buninyong and surrounding areas causing widespread damage from hail and powerful winds, knocking out powerlines and plunging the town into darkness. At approximately 2100hrs the Brigade received its first call for assistance and was kept busy for next several hours assisting the SES clearing roads and assessing storm damaged properties, a task which lasted well into Saturday morning and afternoon.



It was great to see the community coming out after the storm to help each other out. It's a good feeling to know that in our district we are surrounded by people who are willing to help out others in times of need.

Thankyou to the SES, police and regiments of other services and volunteers for assisting our townships in getting back to normality after this damaging storm event.

The Ballarat City Council CEO Anthony Schinck said that changes had been made to better use resources, expand services and increase standards without using extra funds. The Friends are concerned that the original aims of the bequest to build Clark the Robert Centre are being compromised by encouraging all community groups to book and use the facility, and that the nursery was only propagating begonias and all other plants were now outsourced.






