
Lions Club of Buninyong Mt Helen Inc. P.O.Box 254, Buninyong, 3357.

One of our aims at our club is to try and mix the traditional Lions obligations with a smattering of social activities. We believe in the old adage "all work and no play etc.". To this end, a group of Lions and their partners went to see The Phantom of the Opera at Her Majesty's theatre in Ballarat. What a great night and all credit must go to the producers, performers, scene designers, lighting people etc., for producing a live show of the highest standard.

Community Service.

One of our members works as a nurse at Talbot Place in Dana Street Ballarat. This is a home for people who suffer from Dementia and is under the banner of Ballarat Health.

At the rear of the premises is a lovely outside area with lawn, gardens and seating but, because it did not have a fence, could not be used by the patients. It was suggested that the Lions Clubs of our Zone get together and put up a suitable fence.

Through our Zone Chairman, Dawn Fischer, we contacted all our Zone Clubs and with the help of our Club, Sebastopol, Haddon and the Ballarat Clubs we gathered the funds required and, with the help of Mesh and Masonry in Sebastopol, we ordered the material.

During March, members from the Buninyong Mt Helen, Haddon and Sebastopol Lions Clubs erected a 1.2/mtr high "pool type" fence with

two security gates meaning that the garden is now accessible to the patients of Talbot Place to sit and enjoy.





Assistance to Bushfire Victims.

One of our members, Lion Simon Jess, organised for a group of us to travel up to Laharum at the foot of the Grampians, to work with Blazeaid in assisting those landholders who suffered damage through the recent bushfires. We all worked through Sunday then five of us stayed overnight and helped out on the Monday.

Another of our members, Lion Cathy Maguire donated fifty bales of hay which we took up and left with the organisers to be distributed.

Blazeaid is a purely voluntary organisation dedicated to helping those affected by any sort of natural disaster. Their funding is by donations and assistance from service groups, farmers etc., and as can be seen from the next photo, does enormous an amount of work in need. Volunteers are provided with meals, sites for caravans or tents and full insurance.




On the Monday we were there, there were thirty two volunteers working and they represented every single state of Australia. Many were "grey nomads" on their travels who heard of the need for help and gave of their time to assist those affected.

We worked on pulling down old burnt fencing and then putting up new fencing on two farms. Each group of four or five volunteers works under a Team Leader on jobs that are allocated to each team at the "morning musters" held after breakfast.



A BIG DAY PLANNED FOR YENDON

The Yendon Recreation Reserve Committee and the Yendon History Group are combining to hold a day of commemoration and celebration on Sunday 27th April.

In 1935, former students of the Yendon School contributed to the cost of a pair of ornamental gates, which were officially opened on 30th March that year. After the school closed in 1993 it was sold, so the gates became privately owned. Now these gates have been restored to public ownership, and to celebrate the 150th anniversary of the opening of Yendon School, they have been installed at the Yendon Recreation Reserve. They will be officially re-opened in their new position at 12 noon on Sunday 27th.

Since the discovery of the Yendon School Roll of Honour Book two years ago, research has discovered that 60 young men who had spent part of their lives in Yendon went on to serve in World War 1, with 16 of them being killed in action. With the help of Moorabool Shire Council, the Yendon Avenue of Honour has been restored, and it, with a new Honour Board, will be dedicated at a service at 2:00pm. The Creswick Light Horse Brigade will be in attendance, and Yendon school children will take part in the service. Many families of the soldiers have been contacted, and are coming to join the commemoration.





Save Civic Hall and Ballarat Residents and Rate Payers Association response to VicRoads proposal

The announcement by Premier Napthine concerning the relocation of VicRoads head office to Ballarat if his Government wins the next State election will be welcomed by many residents of Ballarat for its potential to boost the local economy. However, his proposal to site a new VicRoads head office on the Civic Hall site is unlikely to be met with the same enthusiasm and universal acceptance.

As the current furore over Councils planning application to seek demolition of the Civic Hall attests, the Civic Hall and its site have a special place in the hearts of a great many Ballarat people. Over 2000 objections have now been lodged against Council's plans to demolish the hall and all other facilities and vegetation on the site. There is no doubt the fate of the Civic Hall, and how it is resolved, is set to become a major issue in the next Ballarat Council election. Mr Napthine, by his announcement today, has now made it a State election issue. If Mr Napthine hopes to win Ballarat seats he will need to consult very closely with the community, and listen very carefully to local sentiment about the proper outcome for this very significant site.

The Civic Hall was designed and built as a result of an Act of Parliament and a local plebiscite in 1939. (The Second World War delayed its construction until the early 1950's). So the Civic Hall was built as a result of a highly democratic process and was deemed by the Act of Parliament to be for the people and PERMANENT. This Council, and now the State Government, are taking decisions without considering the significance of the hall and its site for the people - and without proper consultation and consideration of the people's wishes. This behaviour is not democratic, but rather, is authoritarian. Such behaviour by politicians is not likely to be received well and is, therefore, likely to become a factor in the outcome of the next State election in Ballarat.

We expect that the Napthine Government will work closely with the Ballarat community through Save Civic Hall and the Ballarat Residents and Ratepayers Association. Mr Napthine needs to know that this Council, by their actions, their lack of transparency and their wastage of huge sums of ratepayers money, have lost the trust and confidence of the Ballarat community to handle this issue in the best interests of the community. It therefore behoves the Napthine government to approach this issue carefully and work very carefully with the community itself.
