The local Landcare network, Leigh Catchment Group, have operated out of the front rooms of Klaudia Hochhuth's cottage near the Post Office for more years than either can accurately remember. LCG have been undertaking environmental works with private landholders and on public land for at least fifteen years, and it is nearly all that time.

But it is the end of an era, as Klaudia moves out. The Leigh Catchment Group want to thank her and acknowledge that she has never put the low rent up in all those years. Klaudia says she thinks of that as her contribution to Landcare, for 'all the good work you do'.

LEIGH CATCHMENT GROUP

National Tree Day sunshine on July 27th brought out the crowds down to the Union Jack Creek on the edge of Buninyong. Take a peek next time you are passing the Golf Club, by turning down Macs Road and following it to see the forest of new trees. This is on crown land where there used to be just thick gorse. You can even see the creek now but be careful of the banks which are unstable. This was the fourth year of planting around National Tree Day time and you can start to see the beginnings of the woodland it will become. 840 plants went in this year, within three hours and 37 people registered themselves in. Success was also due to the helpers who came out the Saturday before, to rip with a tractor and lay out all the stakes in preparation.

This was a special planting because a fifth of the plants had been grown from seed by volunteers in the 'Back from the Brink' Project funded through the Communities for Nature Grant Program. This meant that local species which had been missing from plantings in recent years (Silver Banksia, Black Sheoak, Yarra and Snow Gum) had been identified as important to the landscape and had been grown

This year and last, over 2000 such plants have been planted out in over 10 hectares of plantings across a dozen properties around Buninyong, along with other associated species of trees, shrubs and grasses. This will really help the local birds and fauna find homes they need to survive in uncertain

climatic times. For further community planting dates see 'Calendar' on www.leighcatchme ntgroup.org. It would be great to see as many new 'planters' out as at this event.

Happy Birthday Civic Hall

The Civic Hall is now approaching its 58th birthday. It was opened grandly with a community concert on 20 August 1956, followed by further concerts and balls.

With the hall still closed, the grass-roots community group, **Save Civic Hall** will celebrate the event more modestly with a fund-raiser film at the Regent Cinema.

"The Hundred Foot Journey" is a film about an Indian family who move to France and open an eatery across the street from a Michelin-starred French restaurant run by Madame Mallory. It is a PG rated drama starring Helen Mirren and based on the acclaimed book by Richard Morais.

The film starts at 6.30pm on Wednesday 20 August. Tickets are \$15 and are available from Peter Fletcher, on 0411 120 733, or other members of the *Save Civic Hall* Coordinating Committee.

Although the City of Ballarat is planning a participatory community planning process to develop a 'whole of site master plan', it has not withdrawn its application for demolition of the hall and all buildings on the site.

Therefore **Save Civic Hall** continues to gather objections and to raise funds in the eventuality of having to take the issue to VCAT.

To date over 3,000 formal objections have been made to the proposed demolition. These have been received from the Ballarat community and region and Melbourne as well as from international Art Deco organisations.

HISTORIC WINDERMERE SCHOOL TO BE SOLD

Front page of the Ballarat Courier July 24, 2014

pictured a disappointed Yuille Park Community College principal **Clete Paige** looking through the gates of the Windermere Primary School that show the date 1857. The school has been earmarked for sale and Clete has put in a submission to the Education Department that the school site be used for an environmental education centre that would have encompassed tree planting, horticulture and land care education. To date, this proposal has not been accepted.

NEW ST PETER AND PAUL CHURCH OPENED

The Ballarat Courier "Business in Focus" July 16, 2014 page 18 announced that the new church extension of **St Peter and Paul's Church** in Buninyong was completed and it would be blessed and officially opened on July 20 by Bishop Paul Bird The architect was Richard Falkinger AO who produced a design for an octagonal church which would feature large areas of stained glass and was still attached to the original church. The tender was won by local building firm S J Weir. Renowned

artists Janusz and Magdalena Kuzbiki were commissioned to design and produce the windows and internal fittings such as the altar, the tabernacle, the baptismal font and the lectern and a figure of the Risen Christ which will be suspended above the altar.

OUT OF THE GROUND FESTIVAL

The Melbourne Cup weekend this year, November 1 and 2, will see a two day Out of the Ground Festival involving food producers and wineries across the Ballarat and Moorabool regions. The organiser, **Wayne Whykes** said that three shuttle buses would travel between five farms on day one of the festival. BUNINYONG RECREATION PRECINCT






